2019 Research Priorities

- 1. Growing Citrus in screenhouses/greenhouses in containers.
 - Growing requirements including light, soil mixes, and nutrition.
 - New ways to control citrus pests & pre shipment treatments.
- 2. Methods and/or strategies to inhibit ACP/HLB infestation in and around nurseries.
- 3. Development and Evaluation of HLB resistant varieties, including development of accelerated evaluation methods for HLB resistance and fruit quality.
- 4. New diagnostic methods and devices for citrus diseases.
- 5. Develop labor saving systems or equipment applicable to citrus nurseries under protected environments.
- 6. Development of new scion and rootstock varieties.
 - Development of thornless variations of current varieties.
- 7. Best management practices to protect soil and water at California citrus nurseries.
